One Christmas Eve Service - 2 times!

What Christmas will be like this year, we do not know yet. However, this we do know: It will be different. The leadership team at Trinity has developed two possible plans for Christmas Eve, depending on what happens through December with Covid cases and public health measures.

If the curve is flattened once again, and restrictions are lifted to YELLOW or ORANGE, we will offer hybrid Christmas Eve services, with some gathered in person, and others online (similar to September and October). In person, the service will be much less interactive than usual Christmas Eves, to ensure all the gathered people's health and safety. People are asked to **REGISTER IN ADVANCE** if they plan to attend in person. Maximum seating capacity will be set to ensure that everyone who comes may be able to maintain physical distance of 6 feet between households. As such, the service will be offered more than once, at 7:00 p.m. and 8:15 p.m. Other times will added if these are full, but at this time we are only planning for two, knowing that many will participate online only. Online registration for in-person attendance will be available at https://reopen.church/r/Mzkk83 and will open on Pw December 14, if restrictions permit. You may also register by phone through the Trinity office.

If, however, we remain in **RED** (even if restrictions are somewhat lifted), the two Christmas Eve services will be online via Zoom only, which you can attend by computer, tablet or telephone. No pre-

registration is required, however, our attendance is capped at 100 households, so if we reach maximum attendance at the first one you are welcome to attend the second! If your choice of time is important, (7 pm or 8:15 pm) please log in a few minutes earlier than you might otherwise plan to do). Portions of the Christmas Eve service will also be uploaded to our YouTube channel for any time viewing.



In all cases, (red, orange, or yellow) we look forward to showing a Virtual Pageant Video (Trinity's Best/Worst Christmas Pageant Ever!) that congregation members are working on – even now! We also look forward to using your submitted candle lighting photos/videos (see Advent article). For instructions for viewing church online see the article in this newsletter.

"I'll Be Home For Christmas" – A Different Kind of Advent



This year, as we begin the season leading up to Christmas, we know that things will not be as usual. Still, we know that even a pandemic does not stop the message from Christmas, and it is perhaps the kind of time when Christmas is most needed! So, while we will be in our homes, we invite you to join us on our Advent journey.

On Sunday, November 29, we will introduce the theme for our Advent season with communion in our various homes. We will also begin to light Advent candles. (see separate article about this year's Advent wreath)

Sunday, December 6 our theme is "Longing for Home" as we consider the times and places when we don't feel very much at home.

Sunday, December 14, we "Prepare him Room" and on Sunday December 20 we reflect on "Where God Makes a Home".

Remember that if you do not have technology that allows you to join us for worship, you can receive copies of our worship materials in print through the Trinity office and you are always with us in spirit.



We are also hoping that for Christmas Eve, we might find ways to share the light whether or not we can be in person. Through the month of December, we would like as many people as possible to send us photos of themselves lighting a candle. We want to see the light in our eyes and on our faces! We hope to put it together with a special piece of music that the choir and friends are creating in December. We will also take action shots - so a 5 second video of you lighting a candle would also work. Send in your photos to trinityu@mts.net!

You have until **December 20** to get them in. If you would like Julie to record you lighting a candle via Zoom, that opportunity will also be available. Look for email announcements in December about zoom options. For those without access to technology, if you would like us to take a curbside photo of you with a lit candle, give us a call and we can do that too.

Advent and Christmas Music Plans

What is Christmas without music and carols? And yet, singing together is a thing we must do with great caution during a pandemic. At Trinity we have been giving a lot of thought to ways that we might

share the music of Christmas this year. Here's some of what we have in mind.

On Monday, December 21, we will offer an online Evening of Music and Contemplation via **Zoom from 7 – 8:30 p.m.** to be concluded with candle light communion. Guest musicians like Shane Smith, Audrey MacFarlane, Ed & Rhea Goertzen, Allison McEwing and others will provide background Christmas music in the decorated Trinity sanctuary. (*IF* restrictions are released to at least Orange level and allow us to have people in the building, we will offer communion and candle lighting in person on a walk through basis as well.)

We are creating a choir anthem for Christmas Eve one singer at a time! Singers will get a practice recording to sing along to, and then come into the church in December (one at a time) to sing into the microphone (with their headphones on – they can pretend to be a real recording star for a few minutes!). We'll put all the voices together and see what we get! It's a giant experiment, but if you would like to be one of the singers, please be in touch with the office to get your rehearsal tape and book a recording appointment.

Advent Wreath – Together and Apart



December 6
Light one candle for peace.
Because the world is broken

and the wait is long, but we refuse to be frozen by fear. Peace comes in fits and starts – a deep breath, a courageous truth, a humble heart. "Prepare the way," she whispers, "for Christ comes to make the broken whole." So we light one candle, because it only takes one: Christ with us.

Traditionally at Trinity an Advent wreath uses 4 blue candles and 1 one Christ candle in the centre. Each week of Advent we will light one more candle, and light the white one on Christmas Eve. We would invite you to do that with us from home. Your Advent wreath can be simple or very elaborate. If putting together a full Advent wreath is difficult. this year, we invite you to find just one candle that you can light each week. Please find below the words that we will be using with our Advent candles at Trinity this year, so that even if you can't join us on a Sunday morning, you can join us in your home.

November 29

Light one candle for hope. Because the world is broken and the wait is long, but hope just won't let go.

Hope holds space for all our longings, lingers on the edge of harsh reality like the dawn gently awakening the sky. "Keep awake," she whispers, "for the world is being made new."

So we light one candle, because it only takes one: Christ with us.

December 13

Light one candle for joy.
Because the world is broken and the wait is long, but our joy cannot be contained.
Like a toddler, toppling the thrones of power with a gleeful swipe, Joy pierces our silence with a song, interrupts our sighing with laughter, unshackles our fumbling feet to dance.

"My soul magnifies my God," she whispers, "and my Spirit rejoices in God my savior." So we light one candle, because it only takes one: Christ with us.

December 20

Light one candle for love. Because the world is broken and the wait is long, but love never ends.

Love faithfully goes about the work of casting out fear, speaking truth, healing the deepest wounds, crossing the divide from this world to the next and back again.

This is an option whether you have a smartphone, a desktop computer, a tablet, or a landline telephone, although your experience will be different, depending on what equipment is available to you.

For every Trinity Zoom church experience in December, you can use the same instructions – same link, same phone numbers, same meeting I.D. same passcode. For your convenience, the link is listed on the front page of our website

(unless we have a glitch, in which case, be patient - we'll make more noise eventually!) FOCUS Thanks You for Your Support



Normally at this time of year FOCUS would be inviting you to our annual appreciation dinner. Unfortunately due to COVID19, this will not be taking place. We regret not being able to see you in person and share a meal together, but given the serious nature of the pandemic we feel it is a necessary sacrifice, as we all have each other's welfare in mind. Our wish is that you and all your loved ones would remain healthy and safe.

We would like to share the success of FOCUS 2020 with you, as it is really **your** success we celebrate as supporters of FOCUS. Without your support there would be no FOCUS.

In 2020 the FOCUS Grow Project raised \$200,000 for the Canadian Foodgrains Bank. After the matching contribution from the Government of Canada at 4:1, the total money raised for the developing countries aid will be \$1,000,000.00.

This contribution is the result of the combined efforts of monetary donations, land to grow the crops, inputs like seed, fertilizer, crop sprays, equipment to get the work done, and of course you, which without none of it would be possible. So, again we would like to say thank you!

Deadline for 2020 Contributions!

If you wish to top up your 2020 donations, they must be received in the office no later than **noon**, **December 31**, to be eligible for the taxation year 2020. Charitable donations in Manitoba (after the first \$200) receive a 46% tax credit. This means that if you pay income



tax, your donation costs you roughly half of what you give.

Connecting and Caring

At this time, hospital and care home visiting by the church has been suspended, due to Covid-19.



Households are encouraged to remain separate. We are asked not to physically visit with one another. Many of our Christmas and church activities must therefore be altered. Still, let us continue to care. This year, our Caring Friends will not be able to deliver flowers to Trinity connections, but we still plan to reach out by mail. We invite all those who are able to make a caring phone call to someone in your Trinity family this season, to reach out and remember that we are in this together. A Note from Your Stewardship Team



Why do we ask for \$ when we have \$ in investments?

As a result of extremely generous donations, Trinity has money in investments. Just like personal finances, we try to meet our annual expenses with our annual income and see our investments as a reserve for projects, unexpected expenses and unexpected shortfalls. Some of the investments are allocated to funds* that have been set up for a specific purpose. As an example, the chimes fund is for repair and maintenance of the chimes. Our investment committee has invested money in longer-term investments with the expectation or hope to grow this investment for future use.

In 2017, we finished the year with a shortfall of \$4,649.29, in 2018, we ended the year with a shortfall of \$30,604.86, and in 2019 we had a shortfall of \$18,541.58. These shortfalls were covered by money held in our investments. Our 2020 budget is for a deficit of \$53,678.19, however, we would love to end the year without a shortfall!

Recently, the investment committee has allocated \$25,000.00 from the investments for Trinity's 2021 budget. We would love it if we did not have to use all of this allocation in 2021 or end up needing more.

Where does the custom of the Advent wreath originate?



The origins of this custom are lost in the mists of time, but probably are rooted in the ancient

practices surrounding the winter solstice. As the days grew shorter, the number of lights in the home was increased to symbolize the desire for the return of the sun. Evergreens were shaped into circles and adorned with lights to symbolize the return of light and life. Our practice of using a wreath of lights during Advent started in 17th century Germany, but did not become widespread until the middle of the 20th century. Think of the Advent wreath as the church's clock counting down to Christmas!
