Ways to Observe Good Friday



Trinity will not be offering a Good Friday service this year. However, there are many different ways you can observe this holy day at home. Perhaps you might choose one of the following options.

- 1. Alternative online service options will be provided via social media and email updates a few days prior to Good Friday.
- 2. Perhaps you might take two minutes of silence to honour Jesus' life and death, and pray for those who continue to be unjustly crucified in our world. If you wish, read a bible story of how Jesus died. If you would like a story bible version. be in touch with the church office, and we can make one available to you. You might say this prayer (or similar words): Loving God we come into your presence and we/l can only be still. Still because we do not know what to say or do. This is a day for sadness, it is a day for lament; it is a day to acknowledge all of the things we wish were not so Be with us in the shadow of the cross. Be with us in our grief this day. Sit with us in our gloom. Stay with us so that we may find a sure ground of faith, a firm support of hope and the strong assurance of your love -

today, and each time bad things happen. Amen.

- 3. If the weather allows, go for a walk by yourself, and notice your surroundings - where are the signs of life and death visible? If weather or mobility to do not allow, find a window in your home where you can see outside. Consider the lessons in Jesus' words in John 12:24: "Listen carefully: Unless a grain of wheat is buried in the ground, dead to the world, it is never any more than a grain of wheat. But if it is buried, it sprouts and reproduces itself many times over. In the same way, anyone who holds on to life just as it is destroys that life. But if you let it go, reckless in your love, you'll have it forever, real and eternal." (The Message translation)
- 4. On Friday or Saturday, visit a cemetery. Perhaps tend the grave of a family member, friend or stranger.
- 5. As we continue our "Grow With Us" theme, reflect on Wendell Berry's poem, "The Man Born to Farming." To hear Wendell read his poem, visit https://onbeing.org/poetry/theman-born-to-farming/. How does this poem connect to Jesus' story for you? The grower of trees, the gardener, the man born to farming, whose hands reach into the around and sprout. to him the soil is a divine drug. He enters into death vearly, and comes back rejoicing. He has seen the light lie down in the dung heap, and rise again in the corn. His thought passes along the row ends like a mole. What miraculous seed has he swallowed that the unending sentence of his love flows out of his mouth

like a vine clinging in the sunlight, and like water descending in the dark?

- 6. Good Friday often offers space for solitary reflection, but we do not need to face this day alone. As Thomas Bandy says, "God's call is rarely a call to do something. It is always a call to be with somebody." Certainly, Jesus' death came because of his commitment to live in love and justice for God's people. Who in your circle might be finding this a difficult day? How can you reach out to them today?
- 7. Somewhere in your home, clean, oil or even paint a door. Focus on the divine activity of opening and closing doors. Pray as you work.
- 8. Sing a Good Friday song. It might be something like 144 VU "Where you there when they crucified my Lord?" Sometimes it causes me to tremble, tremble, tremble... or it might be one that speaks to the Easter sense of vigil, like 182 VU "Stay with us through the Night". Stay with us through the night. Stay with us through the pain. Stay with us, blessed stranger Till the morning breaks again.

When can we come to church in

person?

The government public health orders continue to urge us to be careful and cautious as



we move towards reopening. However, guidelines do allow us to have up to 25% capacity for church services at this time. As such, the Leadership Team has decided that those who wish to come to worship in person may do so as of Palm Sunday, March 28 2021. (Provided there are no changes to the order). We will still continue to offer church online via Zoom, and those who wish to participate online are encouraged to do so. particularly as it allows those who wish to be present in person to come in safety. If you are feeling unwell in any way, we urge you to stay home and join us online, rather than come to the church building.

For those who attend in person, please remember that masks will be mandatory, and that households must still distance from one another (this is true even for those who may have been vaccinated). You will be asked to sanitize your hands as you enter, and names and phone numbers will be recorded for the purposes of contact tracing, in the unlikely event that it is required by public health. Please enter through one of the black Tupper Street doors (sanctuary or office level). All other entry doors (including the green south door) will remain locked. The elevator will be available for use - one person

at a time, with external operators as required. While we are glad for the

opportunity to have more options to gather together at this special time of year, there are several things that we simply

will not be able to do together yet. We will not celebrate communion on Easter. There is no Sunday School, although children are welcome to come and stay with their household group. We will not be able to sing hymns together, or have our Easter breakfast. We look forward to a time in the future when we can welcome the whole family back together for food and celebration, but for now, we take it one small step at a time.

Easter Sunday Joy in the Garden



You can join us to celebrate Easter in two ways this year.

If circumstances or your preferences keep you at home, you are welcome to join us LIVE ONLINE via our Zoom platform for our special Easter celebration which will begin at 10:30 a.m. Advantages of being at home include being able to join us from the comfort of whatever place in your home

you choose, and you can even stay in your pajamas if you wish! There will be no Easter breakfast this year, but you can participate in online church over breakfast at home! The video portions of our Easter service are likely easier to see on your home devices than in the light of the church sanctuary. You can sing out loud! As we know well by now, you protect the health and safety of your community by staying home as much as possible.

However, provided public health orders continue to allow us to have 25% capacity for church, you can also choose to join us LIVE and IN PERSON at Trinity on Easter Sunday, and worship will begin

at 10:30 a.m. Advantages of coming to the church building include the opportunity to celebrate Easter in the presence of others from your church family who may not live in your house! While we can worship anywhere, it is true that the church setting can provide a heightened sense of mystery. awe and wonder. While we will make use of technology to share in worship, you don't have to be responsible for it or figure out how to connect to zoom! You can ring bells and sing in your heart. We will take every precaution to ensure that the health and safety of the faith community is maintained for those who attend in person.

We have recently learned of the death of K. Thomas Haggerty, 87, of Airdrie Alberta. Tom started his work with the church here at Trinity Portage, active in many areas of the church, including couple's club that he

and Elaine attended together. His involvement at Trinity led to an opportunity

where he, Elaine and their children spent 8 years working with the Shanta Bhwan Hospital in Kathmandu, Nepal on behalf of The United Church of Canada (1963-1967; 1968-1972). Tom later served congregations in Manitoba and Saskatchewan during 9 years of Designated Lay Ministry.
