Concert proposal: Danny Carroll, Winnipeg Musician/Composer

I would like to apply to perform a concert at Trinity United in October, on a Friday evening. (13, 20 or 27)

The intent is to create an atmosphere for people that is relaxing and calm. I also share stories and thoughts through spoken and musical sharing of some of my journey, and of the music.

I would plan the concert for 7:30 pm, with load in and set up at 4pm. The concert will be approximately 90 minutes, and load out from 9-10pm

I use SHOWPASS for purchasing advance tickets on line. And would like to have tickets available at the door also. (Would there be a volunteer or staff member that could help with that?)

I understand that the piano's last tuning was in April. If there is no tuning done by the church before the concert date I would ask that I could hire a tuner to do it (perhaps split the cost?)

I have just performed at my album release concert Aug 30 at Westworth United Church in Winnipeg. The concert supports the release of the album KEYS FOR TRANSFORMATION on Sept 1. This is all original compositions. You can hear the album on all of you favourite streaming sites (Spotify, Apple Music)

These compositions combine gentle grand piano-centred melodies with strings and some electronics. My neo classical-crossover style has the intent of providing an intimate sound healing experience that will help to connect you to the sounds of your heart, and support your personal journey of transformation.

For concerts outside of Winnipeg I am hoping to bring some string players with me. That will be determined later. I will perform 6 of the tunes on the album, and the rest is other solo piano works.

Requests have also come in for communion. Coverage for both needs it to be a United Church clergy, and Lynne isn't scheduled for any Sundays here until December 3.

Karen Tjaden may be able to give communion, Kim will ask Sylvia to reach out. Otherwise, Lynne could do it on December 3.

Discussion about the baptisms: It seems unfair to ask a visiting minister to baptize families they do not know. We should hold off until we have a regular minister again if possible.
